

# SUMMER SCHOOL

## FINE ARTS EDUCATION

**8th edition of the popular summer schools focused on education and experiential cultural experience**

**Venue: Faculty of Education, Palacký University Olomouc, Czech Republic**

**Duration: July 10 – August 19, 2026**

**Capacity: 16 students per class max**

**ECTS credits: 8**

### **Brief content**

This course invites participants to explore art-making as a means of intercultural dialogue and creative exchange. Through hands-on studio work and collaborative projects, they will engage in artistic processes that foster mutual understanding, cooperation, and shared cultural awareness. Participants will develop their English communication skills while experiencing Western culture through direct involvement in art creation. To express personal and cultural themes, they will experiment with a variety of traditional and contemporary media – including drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpture, printmaking, spatial and textile art. The program also introduces participants to new media practices and museum-based art education, encouraging them to connect artistic expression with reflection on cultural identity and global perspectives.

### **General topics and themes of the course:**

- Drawing, painting
- Print art
- Ceramics, sculpture
- Textile art
- Museum and gallery education
- New media art

All teaching, exercises and activities are provided in English.

**Programme fee for one participant: EUR 1130**

### **Programme fee includes:**

- Accommodation in a triple room (up to 5 weeks)
- Lecturing and workshops
- Trips to Prague, Vienna and Lednice – Valtice Area
- Visits to ZOO, bowling, laser arena, rope park, aquapark, Fortress of Knowledge
